Among her awards and honors are ABET's Claire L. Felbinger Award for Diversity and Inclusion, ASCE's Professional Practice Ethics and Leadership Award, University of Texas Regents Outstanding Teaching Award, the Society of Women Engineers' Distinguished Engineering Educator Award, and ASCE's President's Medal. Pearson is a registered Professional Engineer, a Commissioner on ABET's Engineering Accreditation Commission, and host of Engineering Change Podcast, which has audiences in over 70 countries on six continents.

MSF was founded in 1971 in Paris by a group of journalists and doctors. Today, they are a worldwide movement of nearly 65,000 people.

Shawn M. Carraher, received his Ph. D. from the University of Oklahoma and was awarded the Oxford Journal Distinguished Research Professorship at the University of Cambridge. He has served as Division Chair of the Management History and Technology & Innovation Management Divisions as well as past President of the Small Business Institute & the SouthWest Academy of Management as well as Dean of the Counsel of Endowed Chairs and Past Division Chairs within the AOM TIM Division. He is Clinical Professor of International Business at the University of Texas at Dallas. In 2015 at the Said Business School Shawn was named one of the top 50 Outstanding Global Business Educators and then in 2016 was named among the dozen most impactful professors in Business in the world in Switzerland. In 2022 Research.com named him one of the top 550 professors in terms of academic impact in Business & Management in the USA. He supports the academic potential of his students without regard to their background and is one of two faculty in the School of Management identified as mixed race.
